Student guide for completing assignments with Posterous

Sending the Teacher Your Address

Your teacher's email address is: **teacher will replace this text @ email.com**

Your teacher will collect email addresses from everyone in the class, and then add them into Posterous.

If you are using regular email on a computer

Write an email addressed to your teacher (the email address is listed above). Type "Posterous" in the subject line and remember to say who you are in the email.

If you are using Text or Picture messages on a phone

Step One: Write a plain (text only) message to your teacher (the email address is listed above). Type "Posterous" in the subject line and remember to say who you are in the message.

Step Two: Send a multimedia (photo or video) message to your teacher (the email address is listed above). Type "Posterous" in the subject line and remember to say who you are in the message.

Why send two?

Some providers have one address for plain text and a second address for multimedia messages.

The website address for your Posterous is: **http:// teacher will replace this text .posterous.com**

The shared password for this site is: teacher will replace this text (Optional! See the teacher's guide)

Add to the Site

Compose an email or text message to: **post@ teacher will replace this text .posterous.com**

Remember:

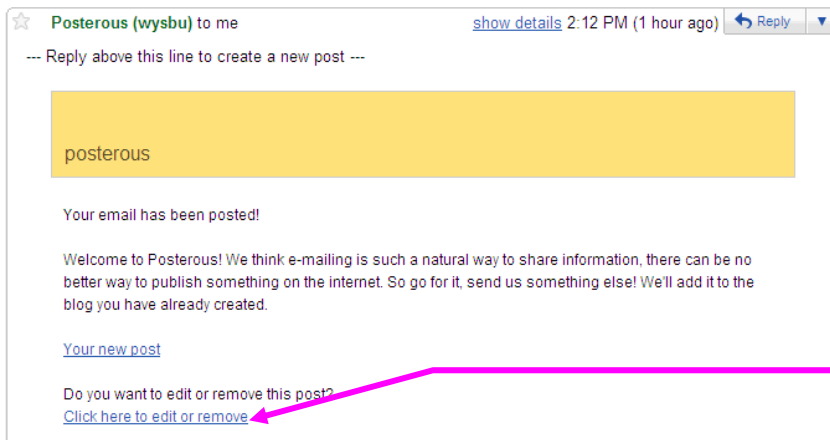
It can take up to 20 minutes to display your information on the site. Be patient!

A Note About Cell Phones and Mobile Devices

Most carriers charge an additional fee for text messaging, picture/video messaging, or data (accessing the Internet). Students and parents should review their service plan carefully to see if an additional fee would be incurred.

Service providers often have bundles and packages that cover these options. If you are unsure about fees that may be incurred from using Text Messaging or the Internet from a phone please contact your service provider.

Edit or Delete a Post



Students can Edit and Delete their post with a **special link that is automatically sent** via email.

In this example, Posterous sent a reply to a web-based email account on a computer.

Clicking on the **special link** will take the student to the Posterous website where the student may edit or delete the post that prompted this receipt.

A Note about Accessing the Internet on a Phone

Should a student receive this email receipt from a cell phone post, clicking on the link from a phone will send the student to the Internet. Much like texting plans, phone companies also sell Internet data plans. Students and Parents should make an informed decision based on their phone's service plan.

A Work-Around for Students Posting from a Phone

Students may forward the email from their cell phone to a web-based email account and access the link by computer. This would allow a student to access the post (on the rare occasion that it needs to be removed or edited) without incurring Internet data charges on the cell phone if an Internet data plan is not included in their monthly bill.

Remember! A cell phone provider can answer questions about your service plan. Call the customer service representatives.

A Note about Privacy

At the time of authoring this page, no email addresses or phone numbers are visible to the general Internet audience. The person who signed up for the Posterous account has access to a Manage page, which is only accessible by password. From this page, addresses are stored for posting permission.
